William Fred Bursey passed peacefully on Monday, May 31, 2019. He was born on July 25, 1949 to William Fred Bursey, Sr. and Geraldine Alexander Bursey.

Fred attended Keller High School and received his BS from Texas Tech University.

He was Vice President of Morrison Milling Corporation, Flour Millers, facilitating the grain and commodities division.

Fred was past president of the Texas Grain and Feed Association. Fred was a member in good standing of the Cleburne Masonic Lodge #315 for 47 years.

He was a distinguished National Bullseye pistol shooter with his Colt 1911. S.A.S.S. World, National and State Champion of Cowboy Action Shooting. Rifle and Pistol Silhouette champion. National & Texas State Sporting Clays Champion in addition to Sportsman Team Challenge.

Fred was a lifelong rancher, producing and breeding registered Hereford cattle on the family ranches in Keller and Cleburne, Texas.

What's fast and fun? Wild Bunch!

Sometimes without effort a match just clicks and falls into place perfectly.

It was decided that trail walk would provide the opening staccato of welcomed gunfire with 28 rounds of justice dealt from the barrel of a 45. Back to the targets opening line "you dirty rat" and the beep of the timer

Starting with a brand new Evil Roy target fitted with a 5" and a 3 1/2" gong 7 shots alternated, moving to the 7 swingers then 3 autoset plus 4 swingers, moving to the second set for a 7 round sweep made for an exciting stage. Looking to the fort a quick stage was planned with 9 shotgun and 14 pistol. Shotgun loaded with 5 reload as needed finishing with pistol 2 Nevada sweeps. This was all shot from center table and was highly popular.

Stage number 3 found us under the welcome shade of Brazos Point where the shooter found themselves in an imaginary model T with Poncho Villa's bandits trying an ambush. 7 shots on the tree seated, move to the left for 7 more, left again for 7 more then pick up the POC rifle for 7 at 25 yards or the doughboy rifle for 5.

Moving to the old school house area found the Wild Bunch in another altercation that started on the left side 1-2-1-2-1 and then moving behind mandatory cover for right hand side same sweep for 7 again on left for 7 center knockdown snuffcans and 2 bells then from same cover shoot the POC for 7 or the further targets with the doughboy rifle for 5. Everyone was hungry so over to Sidewinder Sids for a great lunch then back to a fastest pistol 14 rounds alternating on the Evil Roy target gongs. Back under BP for BAMB sniper, combat and GAMM combat. Done with these a popgun match was had featuring a host of 32 automatics and a couple of 380's thrown in to boot. A few of the colt 1903 hammerless, a savage 1907 along with a Walther PPKS rounded out the field. 3 static targets with a Nevada sweep for 7 made for a fast stage. Pistol ready at the beep rack the slide and shoot, 3.35 seconds won it. Packing up and getting ready to leave drove down the range to Shady McLarrys 22 match styled after steel challenge. Looks like fun. Would we like to shoot it? Sure! And yes it was

fun! It's fast! It's fun! Great shooting game anyone can play and have a blast doing it!

THE RIVER RIDERS (AND THE .32-20 WINCHESTER MODEL 94)

During the famous cattle drive days to Kansas and elsewhere in the 1800s, Texas Tick Fever was a common problem. The longhorn cattle seemed to not be bothered by the fever, but cattle in the areas the drives went through were often decimated. Killings often resulted from those conflicts. By the end of the 1800s, another infection from ticks had developed that was equally as devastating on all Texas cattle. In 1906 the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) started the National Cattle Fever Tick Eradication Program. Cowboys on horseback rode the border, turning back or shooting the cattle coming out of Mexico. This epidemic into Texas pretty much got under control, for a while.

Long about 1910, as the Mexican Revolution got going full swing, all the different groups of the war effort, often in small raiding parties, looked upon the United States as easy pickings to raid for all kinds of supplies and food. They raided all across the border as they scavenged. The U.S. became their source for war supplies. Our government was unable to fund the needs for river riders, so local groups, ranchers, and counties would organize river and range riders and pay for horse feed, but the ranchers had to provide food, horses, guns, and men. Dealing with the bandits and raiders was very dangerous work, and people of all factions were killed.

With the death of Pancho Villa in 1923, the Mexican Revolution was mostly over; the need for these River

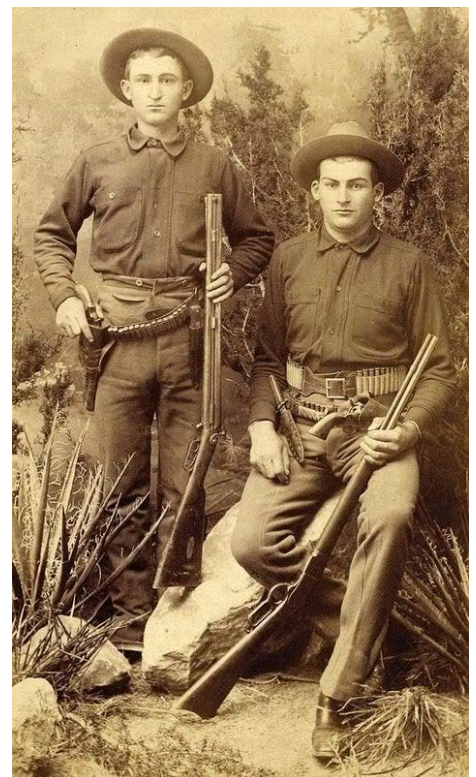
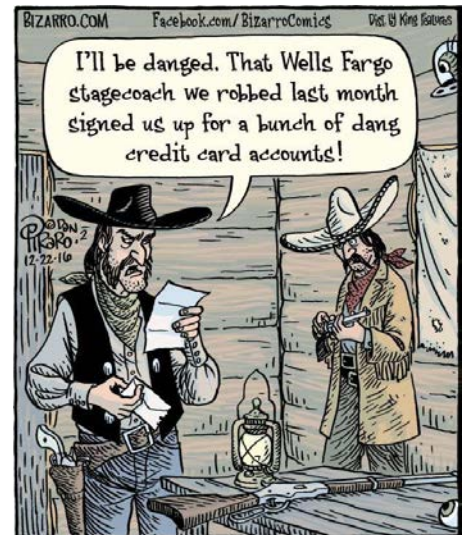
Riders was coming to an end. By the 1930s the rustling, smuggling of livestock, and all kinds of contraband became a real problem along the border again. Added to this dilemma was the bigger problem of the epidemic of bovine hoof-and-mouth disease, brought across by cattle coming into the United States. So the USDA once again brought in the River Riders to control the crossing of livestock by turning them back or killing them. The riders typically rode horseback along the river over eleven mile stretches, camping out, turning around, and then going back the same way. This program lasted till about 1954, at which time the epidemic was "thought" to be contained.

Bill Rogers was one of the River Riders from 1947-1956. Doc Baker (my Dad AKA Staggs Prairie Kid) interviewed Bill in 2010 when Bill was 84 year of age. Bill's job was to prevent the spread of hoof and mouth disease from entering Texas across the Rio Grande. He did this by shooting, killing, and burning the carcass of the Mexican cattle. Bill grew up on the Viejo Ranch north of Candelaria and then on the Boyd Chambers Ranch. Bill was 21 years old when he became a River Rider. At first, he had to furnish everything - 2 horses, feed, food, camping equipment, everything. Eventually the government furnished hay for the horses, wooden floored tents, then aluminum shacks, plus a Mod 94 Winchester Rifle in .32-20 caliber. This is a pistol caliber, but he used it to shoot the diseased cattle.

In the beginning, he and his partner patrolled the river from La Linda to Boquillas, Mexico area. They camped at Marufo Vega in Boquillas Canyon in Big Bend. Bill remembered the army Camp Mercer, built to guard during the Mexican Revolution. He also established a camp in Reagan Canyon for 5 years. Bill said it was

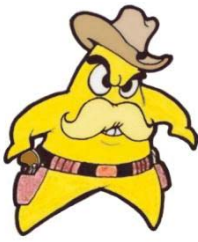
hard but enjoyable work, and looking back, he talked with fondness of his years camping in that wild wilderness region. The area is still wild.

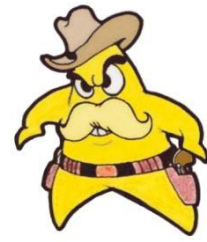
